

### **Code of Conduct**

Our Code of Conduct is comprised of 15 sections; Introduction, Definitions, Student Rights and Responsibilities, Essential Partners, Dress Code, Prohibited Student Conduct, Reporting Violations of the Code of Conduct, Disciplinary Penalties, Procedures and Referrals, Alternative Instruction, Discipline of Students with Disabilities, Corporal Punishment, Student Searches and Interrogations, Visitors to Schools, Public Conduct on School Property, and Dissemination and Review. Additionally, it contains information regarding academic and athletic eligibility procedures. The following is a brief summary of some important aspects of our Code of Conduct. #### Introduction

The West Babylon School District Board of Education is committed to providing a safe and orderly school environment where students may receive, and district personnel may deliver, quality educational services without disruption or interference. Responsible behavior by students, teachers, other district personnel, parents and other visitors is essential to achieving this goal.

The district is committed to safeguarding the rights given to all students under state and federal law. In addition, to promote a safe, healthy, orderly and civil school environment, all district students have the right to take part in all district activities on an equal basis regardless of actual or perceived race, color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sexual orientation, gender or sex.

### **Dignity for All Students Act (DASA)**

Each school building will have assigned DASA coordinators who are expected to coordinate and participate in training in support of the Dignity for All Students Act, address issues of harassment or any situation that threatens the emotional or physical health or safety of any student, school district employee, or any person who is lawfully on school

district property during a school district-sponsored event or off school district property at a school district-sponsored event; identify curricular resources that support the infusion of civility in classroom instruction and classroom management; and provide guidance to staff as to how to access and implement those resources. #### **Dress Code**

All members of the school community are expected to give proper attention to personal cleanliness and to dress appropriately for school and school functions. Students and their parents have the primary responsibility for acceptable student dress, cleanliness and appearance. Teachers and all other district personnel are expected to help students develop an understanding of the dress code by exemplifying acceptable dress and appropriate professional appearance in the school setting.

#### **Prohibited Student Conduct**

The Board of Education expects all students to conduct themselves in an appropriate and civil manner, with proper regard for the rights and welfare of other students, district personnel and other members of the school community, and for the care of school facilities and equipment. District personnel who interact with students are expected to use disciplinary action only when necessary and to place emphasis on the students' ability to grow in self-discipline. The Board recognizes the need to make its expectations for student conduct while on school property or engaged in a school function specific and clear.

#### **Violations of the Code of Conduct**

Students who are found to have violated the district's Code of Conduct may be subject to the following penalties or remedial consequences, either alone or in combination. The school personnel identified after each penalty are authorized to impose that penalty, consistent with the student's right to due process.

The amount of due process a student is entitled to

receive before a penalty is imposed depends on the penalty being imposed. In all cases, regardless of the penalty imposed, the school personnel authorized to impose the penalty must inform the student of the alleged misconduct and must investigate, to the extent necessary, the facts surrounding the alleged misconduct. All students will have an opportunity to present their version of the facts to the school personnel imposing the disciplinary penalty in connection with the imposition of the penalty. Detention, suspension from transportation, suspension from athletic participation, extracurricular activities and other privileges, in or out of school suspension, teacher disciplinary removal of disruptive students from class, and permanent suspension are all examples of disciplinary consequences.

### **Student Lockers, Desks and Other School Storage Places**

Student lockers, desks and other school storage places may be subject to search at any time by school officials, without prior notice to students and without their consent. Students have no reasonable expectation of privacy with respect to these places and school officials retain complete control over them. Authorized school officials can conduct searches of these storage places and shall be responsible for promptly recording the following information about each search: Name, age and grade of student searched or general search, general locker search warrants the location of the lockers, reasons for the search, name of any informant(s), purpose of search (that is, what items were being sought), type and scope of search, person conducting search and his or her title and position, witnesses, if any, to the search, time and location of search, results of search (that is, what item(s) were found), disposition of items found, time, manner and results of parental notification.

#### **Visitors to the Schools**

The Board of Education encourages parents and other district citizens to visit the district's schools and classrooms to observe the work of students, teachers and other staff. Since schools are a place of work and learning, however, certain limits must be set for such visits. The building principal or his or her designee is responsible for all persons in the building and on the grounds. For these reasons, the following rules apply to visitors to the schools: Anyone who is not a regular staff member or current student of the school will be considered a visitor. All visitors to the school must report to the designated area upon arrival at the school. There they will be required to sign the visitor's register, present valid NYS-issued driver's license or government-issued identification, and will be issued a visitor's identification badge, which must be worn at all times while in the school or on school grounds. Visitors attending school functions that are open to the public, such as parent-teacher organization meetings or public gatherings, may be required to register and present valid NYS-issued driver's license or governmentissued identification. All visitors are expected to abide by the rules for public conduct on school property contained in this Code of Conduct.

#### **Public Conduct on School Property**

The district is committed to providing an orderly, respectful environment that is conducive to learning. To create and maintain this kind of an environment, it is necessary to regulate public conduct on school property and at school functions. For purposes of this section of the code, "public" shall mean all persons when on school property or attending a school function, including students, teachers, district personnel, parents, community members and other visitors. The restrictions on public conduct on school property and at school functions contained in this code are not intended to limit freedom of speech or peaceful assembly. The district recognizes that free inquiry and free expression are indispensable to the objectives of the district. The purpose of this code is to maintain public order and prevent abuse of the rights of others. All persons on school property or attending a school function shall conduct themselves in a respectful and orderly manner. In addition, all persons on school property or attending a school function are expected to be properly attired for the purpose they are on school property.

### **Attendance and Lateness**

The Board of Education recognizes that regular school attendance is a major component of academic success. Through implementation of this policy the Board expects to reduce the level of unexcused absences, encourage full attendance by all students and develop effective intervention strategies to improve attendance. Period by period attendance will be taken at all schools and will be recorded as either excused or unexcused. Parents are responsible for notifying the school on the morning of an absence or tardiness. Junior High School and High School students with more than 8 unexcused absences in a half-year course or 15 unexcused absences in a full-year course will be denied credit for that course. Students exceeding 30 days of absence (in any combination of excused or unexcused absences) in a course must be reviewed by the school's principal to determine if course credit/grade promotion is appropriate. Students must be in school by the conclusion of period four to be eligible to participate in co-curricular activities for that day.

### **Transportation Requests**

Applications for Transportation to Private Schools – Requests must be received in the Transportation Office no later than April 1 for the upcoming school year. New applications are required each year. New residents have 30 days to apply for transportation. Completed forms may be dropped off at the District Central Office at 10 Farmingdale Road, West Babylon or FAXED to Transportation at: 631-376-7789. As always, please be sure to keep the Transportation Office informed of any address changes throughout the year. #### **General Bus Stop Information**

For all students, please try to be at your bus stop at least 10 minutes before your scheduled pick up time. For parents with younger children K-2, please be at your scheduled bus stop at least 5 minutes before school dismissal time. It is important that the Transportation Office has an updated contact number for your child.

### **Support Services**

**Special Education:** It is the goal of the West Babylon Public Schools to provide each student with free and appropriate public education in the least restrictive environment. To meet the special educational needs of children with disabilities, the district provides a full continuum, including support services, resource rooms and integrated classes designed to meet the individual youngster's capabilities and learning styles. The network of teaching and support staff is aimed at encouraging students to work and learn with their nondisabled peers to the maximum extent possible. In some cases, the severity of the disability may require placement in special classes or schools operated by the Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES) or in other private schools. However, no placement is made without the approval of the Committee on Special Education and the child's parent.

If you believe that your child (from birth through age 21) may have a disability, you are urged to call the Office of Student Services at 631-376-7030.

Speech and Languages: Speech and language therapists employed by the district work with the speech, language and hearing impaired, and the voice and fluency problems of students ages 3-21 years. Services are determined and provided by the Committee on Special Education/Committee on Preschool Special Education to classified parochial and public students to help remediate these areas. Instructional services are provided in a public or private school setting on an individual or small group basis.

### **Emergency Response**

The West Babylon School District considers the safety and security of our students, staff, parents and school community our highest priority. ### FERPA - Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

This is to advise you of your rights with respect to the school records relating to your child or you pursuant to the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974.

Parents of a student under 18, or a student 18 or older, have a right to inspect and review any and all official records, files and data directly related to the student, including all material that is incorporated into the student's cumulative record folder, and intended for school use or to be available to parties outside the school or school system and specifically including, but not necessarily limited to, identifying data, academic work completed, level of achievement (grades, standardized achievement test scores), attendance data, scores on standardized intelligence, aptitude and psychological tests, interest inventory results, health data, family background information, teacher or counselor ratings and observations, and verified reports of serious or recurrent behavior patterns.

A parent of a student under 18 years of age or a student 18 years of age or older shall make a request for access to the student's school records, in writing, to the elementary principal of the building to which such student is assigned or the guidance chairperson in the secondary school. Upon receipt of such request, arrangements shall be made to provide access to such records within a reasonable period of time, but in no case, no more than 45 days after the request has been received.

If information contained in the student's record is believed to be inaccurate or misleading, the parent or eligible student should write to the district, clearly identifying the part of the record they want changed and specifying why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the district decides not to amend the record as requested, you will be notified of the decision and advised of your right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

Student records and any material contained therein which is personally identifiable, are confidential and may not be released or made available to persons other than parents or students without the written consent of such parents or student. There are a number of exceptions to this rule, such as other school employees and officials, and certain state and federal officials, who have a legitimate educational need for access to such records in the course of their employment.

The district will disclose, upon request, educational records to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll. In addition, the district will disclose a high school student's name, address and telephone number to military recruiters and institutions of higher learning unless the parents or eligible student exercise their right to prohibit release of the information without prior written consent.

The law permits educators to share information with other state and local officials, specified by state statute, as part of the juvenile justice system.

You have the right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by this school district to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA are:

Directory information may be disclosed without prior written consent. Directory information includes a student's name, photos, parents' names, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, participation in school activities or sports, weight and height if a member of an athletic team, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received and most recent previous school attended. Social security numbers and student identification numbers are not considered directory information and will not be released.

Parents or eligible students will have 14 days from the beginning of the school year or date a student enrolls to advise the school district, in writing via a letter to the building principal, of any and all items they refuse to permit the district to designate as directory information for the remainder of the school year.

### **Asbestos Notification**

AHERA (Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1986) is a federal law enacted in 1987. The law required all school districts to inspect the district's buildings for asbestos-containing materials. Our facilities were inspected in accordance with these regulations. Based upon the findings of the inspections, a management plan was adopted by the Board of Education and accepted by the New York State Education Department. A copy of the management plan, six-month surveillance reports, re-inspection reports and abatement reports are on file in the Facilities Office located at 200 Old Farmingdale Road, West Babylon, NY 11704. All plans are available for inspection at the Facilities Office.

#### **Pesticide Notification**

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year. The West Babylon School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications.
