



Pick A Reading Partner (PARP) is here!

What is PARP? PARP is a voluntary reading program that encourages parents/guardians to read with their children for at least 15 minutes a day. The focus is on stressing that

reading together can be fun as well as informative and educational.

Our PARP Program will run from Friday, January 22nd through Friday, February 12th. Every child is encouraged to participate in PARP. Each child participating in PARP will receive a reading log. Parents/guardians will be responsible for signing the reading logs and calendars. We will tally the total number of minutes the students read. We are encouraging students to be creative and use other reading ideas, such as newspapers, magazines, cereal boxes, labels, and street signs. Each week, the minutes will be tallied to keep track of students' reading progress. There will be a track display in the gym hallway. The grade that reads the most minutes over the three-week period will receive a free snack certificate.

Our theme this year is **EXERCISE YOUR MIND – READ!** We are looking for some creative readers to try their hand at illustrating bookmarks incorporating our "Exercise your Mind" theme. Please have your child use the attached template to create their bookmark. Bookmark submissions are due back to the Main Office by February 4th. A bookmark committee will select one winning bookmark from each class. Please include the child's name and teacher name on the back of the submission. We look forward to all students participating in this great event.

In addition, the children will participate in a **Square 1 Art Culminating Activity** where they will have the opportunity to draw their favorite book character or scene from something they read during the 2016 PARP event.
