Report of the Superintendent and /or Educational Presentation

### Capital Project Updates Dr. Farrelly and Mrs. Psarakis

Dr. Farrelly said that this evening the decision of which material to use on the Gym Floor will be made. The flooring choices are between Rezill Channel and Green Play. Mrs. Psarakis with assistance from Mr. Howard and Mr. Graziano provided an overview of the differences between the two floor materials. The green play is a resilient anchored floor system that has subfloor and cushion designs that enhance playing athletic activities the subfloor resists rot and mildew from dampness. The Rezill channel flooring has a plywood subfloor. After some discussion about the pros and cons of each, the trustees decided the green play floor would be the better option. The addendum for the flooring is on tonight's agenda as item #FI-4.

Dr. Farrelly said that during tonight's meeting the work for the turf field and the second phase of the JHS and JFK tiles and the gym floor will also be awarded. She said there is also have a resolution tonight for the interior doors for the JHS to go off BOCES contract. There were no questions about the proposed door changes. Dr. Farrelly noted that Mr. Graziano and Mr. Howard have been meeting to develop athletic calendar changes. Board President Lucy Campasano wanted to ensure that the schedules will be fairly distributed among the teams. Mr. Howard said he believes the schedules will be equitable to the different teams.

The PAC Floor will have carpet squares down the aisles and the Brazilian cherry flooring in the front and back of the PAC. Dr. Farrelly said that they are hopeful that the flooring will be done this year.

<u>Art and Music Program Evaluations</u> — William Doran — K-8 Music & Art Chairperson, Joseph Barone — 9-12 Music Chairperson and Christine Iaquinto — 9-12 Art Chairperson

Mr. Doran, Ms. laquinto and Mr. Barone shared their music and art program evaluations with the Board and administrators. They discussed their programs and the benefits to the students in elementary school with the incorporating of character education, anti-bullying program and building the students' self-esteem and confidence. At the JHS the students learn to interpret their world through art. Through the K-8 music program the students learn respect and tolerance in social relationships. The third grade recorder "Karate" program is going well. The students are earning "belts" as they learn the songs. Mr. Doran said that he is proud of the high level of interest in the music program. He added that the program is experiencing a surge in requests for school owned instruments.

Ms. laquinto said that it has been a great and busy year for the 9-12 Art program. She said she works with a great staff in a terrific program. She noted that students went to the Metropolitan Art Museum through a grant that the district has won for the past six or seven years. She highlighted a student's \$20,000 scholarship from Dowling. She gave a brief overview of the art program and noted that new smart boards and kilns are needed. She said that in early June the K-12 art teachers will meet to collaborate. She thanked those administrators and trustees who attended the Art Honor Society induction.

Mr. Barone shared that the talent concert will be held Thursday evening. He said that it is a testament to West Babylon's music department that there will be five teachers (3 are graduates of West Babylon) participating in the concert. He said that alumni have been invited as well. Mr. Barone added that Mrs. Prendergast will be singing with her daughter. He noted that the program would not be as successful without the support of the elementary music department teachers. Mr. Barone said that the piano lab at the high school is in need of renovations, the keyboards are falling apart and the wiring is unsafe. He also noted that the program lost a full time HS music teacher so the department is doing more with less. He also noted that maintenance for instruments is needed.

Board President Lucy Campasano said that all of the music performances are wonderful. Dr. Farrelly said that the common threads are the needs for equipment throughout the district because those budget lines have been cut throughout the years. She said that the Board is aware of the situation and that there is a plan to address those needs over the next two years.
