Ms. Diamond said an extensive internal audit relating to the review of district-wide attendance procedures/records was completed. Ms. Diamond and Ms. Mezier reviewed records in 10 district buildings. Dr. Farrelly said the four central administrators met with the Superintendent's Management Team to review the concerns noted in the attendance audit and are developing plans to address the concerns. The next step is to meet with union officials to develop a plan. It was discussed that "safety/security" is also tied into attendance to be able to account for all employees in any possible emergency situation. The district's objective is to reduce risk. Board President Lucy Campasano said the Board of Education is committed to address and improve any concerns. The following handouts were provided and are available in the District Clerk's office: Review of Attendance-Report Issued May, 2017; Updated Risk Assessment-2016-2017; Audit Committee Meeting Report-June 13, 2017; and a booklet, created by Cerini & Associates, entitled "Lesson Plan" highlighting "Appropriate Use of Public Funds"; "Medicare Part B Premium on the Rise"; and "An Update on the Free & Reduced School Lunch Program".

Mrs. Michele Psarakis introduced the members of the capital project team: from School Construction Consultants - Mr. Nick Amoruso, President and Mr. Keith DeLucia, our onsite construction manager; and Mr. Ray Graziano, our District Facilities Director. Mrs. Psarakis stated the Tooker Avenue bid awards, from the May 16<sup>th</sup> bid openings, are on the Board of Education agenda — Finance Resolutions FI-9 through FI-12. Discussion was held regarding the Laser Industries Inc. bid as site contractor for Tooker Avenue School. Discussion was held regarding the Tooker Avenue turf field and Dr. Farrelly suggested scheduling a meeting to address any concerns. The Junior High School bids opened on May 23<sup>rd</sup> for the JHS auditorium and art rooms were reviewed and discussed. A Bid Tabulation Sheet handout was distributed by Mrs. Psarakis. Finance Addendum Resolutions FI-13 through FI-16, for the Junior High School bid awards, were approved (as amended) and awarded to SJ Hoerning, Total Construction Corp., Locust Valley Electric and Nickerson Corporation. Regarding the JHS locker rooms: the locker styles will be the same as in the SHS — louvered standard doors with solid sides. The colors chosen were also the same as the SHS locker rooms — Trophy (723) frames with Jersey (719) doors. Selection of wood grain for art room cases was discussed. For the JHS art room, the countertops are standard Black (1595-60) and Premium "Maple Chili" #6000 wood finish was chosen for the casework. For the JHS interior doors-nurse's toilet, 2<sup>nd</sup> floor Faculty restrooms and smoke doors: Species: Red Oak, Color: Ravine, RA07. Photographs of the Tooker Avenue sink/basins and cabinets were shared. The sink basins will be Beige (1530-60) and "Oak Amber" #3000 was selected for the cabinetry. The Tooker Avenue VCT tiles will be similar to that installed at JFK — Cool White with Horizon (Blue) border.
