A REGULAR MEETING of the Board of Education of the West Babylon Union Free School District, of the Town of Babylon, Suffolk County, New York was held on TUESDAY, JUNE 27, 2017, in the Board Room of the Administration Wing adjacent to the Senior High School.

Those present: Trustees Lucy Campasano, Cathy Gismervik, Diane Klein, Dennis Kranz, Jennifer Longo and Jennifer Wandasiewicz. Trustees Ray Downey, John Evola and Peter Scarlatos were absent.

The Board President opened the meeting at 6:03 pm and led those present in the Pledge to the Flag.

Dr. Yiendhy Farrelly opened the meeting by saying another great school year has come to a close. She thanked the Board of Education Trustees and all the staff and faculty members for supporting our students in countless ways throughout the school year. Dr. Farrelly congratulated the district's recent retirees and wished all good health and much happiness in their retirement. She thanked Mr. Hanley for coordinating the retiree celebration held earlier in the evening. The first district "Coding Night" took place. It was a success and Dr. Farrelly thanked Mr. Payne as well as all the others involved in putting together this event. At the July 11th Re-Organization Meeting, Mr. Peter Rodriguez, of Cullen & Danowski (our External Auditor firm), will present the Audit Committee Report. The American Heart Association and Customer Bank donated CPR kits to the district. Dr. Farrelly thanked Ms. Eve Pyser, Regional Director, Youth Market, Western Suffolk County AHA representative for coordinating the donation which will be formally accepted at the next Board meeting. The Spring/Summer Issue of the 2017 SCOPE "Forum" newsletter was available on the counter. Pages 4 and 5 feature the March 2017 Annual Dinner Awards list of WB recipients and photos.

Superintendent's Report/Educational Presentation:

Dr. Yiendhy Farrelly thanked Mr. Payne, Mr. Hanley and the elementary principals for working diligently on several different elementary schedule options. Dr. Farrelly stated, as you know, several months ago, we discussed student enrollment and concerns relating to elementary staffing. Also discussed was concerns relating to the intervention supports we feel our students need. Dr. Farrelly had asked the Board for authorization to utilize elementary staffing in different ways to enhance our services to students. Dr. Farrelly said a plan has been developed that will increase the number of intervention specialists providing student interventions in each elementary building. Some of the highlights of the plan are as follows:

1. Select a formal way to monitor students receiving interventions;
2. Establish blocks of teaching time that will have significantly less pull out services. This will allow our elementary teachers more time with the entire class;
3. Provide more PE time for our elementary students;
4. Establish a rotation schedule of electives that will allow for all students to receive the same amount of intervention services regardless of school days closed;
5. Establish common time during the day for teachers and administrators to meet to support curriculum and instruction;
6. Establish more common prep times for elementary classroom teachers; and
7. While students are receiving intervention services - classroom teachers will have the opportunity to provide enrichment.

Dr. Farrelly said these are all good things for our students. However, this translates into a different schedule that we will need to get used to...and with change, understandably, comes some apprehension. Dr. Farrelly then asked Mr. Payne to provide an overview of next year's elementary schedule.

Mr. Scott Payne, Executive Director of Curriculum & Instruction, provided a handout highlighting the 2017-2018 K-5 Intervention Program. The Intervention Goals are as follows:

1. Increase teacher support for students (more services will better enable us to meet our RtI ("Response to Intervention") needs throughout the district;
2. Develop a common intervention plan throughout the district (centers on students meeting for the same frequency and duration for similar programs);
3. Develop a strategy to minimize students being pulled from class throughout the academic day for interventions; and
4. Allow students to move in and out of interventions as needed.

In addition, Mr. Payne reviewed the specifics of the K-5 schedule for all the elementary buildings.

NEW BUSINESS: None

STATEMENT OF RESIDENTS:

Ms. Kelly Hamblin, a West Babylon resident, shared her concerns regarding the regents "weight/20%" issue and earning a regents diploma. She asked if it is possible to offer a "pathways" parent meeting or parent evening session to clarify student options. Ms. Hamblin feels a student who does not need a regents class to graduate, chooses to take the class as well as the regents exam, may not do well on the exam and then their overall class average is negatively impacted. Dr. Farrelly said this is an involved process which has been reviewed on two separate occasions. Dr. Farrelly along with Mr. Payne, the HS administrators, a team of teachers and department chair people, working together, have researched/analyzed our own student data. It was determined, based on that committee research, the weighting of the regents exam grade would remain as is. With regard to "pathways", Dr. Farrelly said she has conferred with Mr. Payne, Mr. Michael Devane, SHS Assistant Principal and Mrs. Jessica Yawney-Kohler, Junior High School Assistant Principal, to discuss student "pathways". They are currently working on developing a Junior High School/Senior High School Curriculum Guide to share with parents which highlights the multiple paths available to students. Dr. Farrelly agreed with Ms. Hamblin's suggestion that some type of evening parent session was a great idea.

Ms. Sue Tronolone, a West Babylon resident, raised a question regarding how parents can obtain information as to the availability of HS courses offered to students if a student fails a regents. Dr. Farrelly suggested/encouraged parents to call the High School Guidance Office to schedule an appointment to review the Curriculum Guide to see what options a student may have. In addition, concerns regarding special needs students can be addressed at CSE meetings which parents may attend, if applicable. For "classified" students, a parent can reach out to the HS team to specifically review the issue of "effort vs. ability" with regards to

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regents exams. Board Trustee Jennifer Wandasiewicz suggested possibly re-visiting the "No Harm" policy as it relates to IEP students. Dr. Farrelly offered to have Mr. Payne reach out to the HS team to specifically discuss classified students. Based on student/exam criteria, there is an "appeals" process which can be submitted to the principal and Superintendent of Schools for review.

Mrs. Margaret Barrett, SEPTA representative, West Babylon resident, raised a question regarding the K-5 Intervention Plan schedule. She asked if there is a week where students will not have music, art or library. Mr. Payne said in restructuring the elementary schedule, over a 6 day cycle-- as opposed to 5 days, time wise session times will be increased, but students will be missing, on occasion, one of the 3 special area classes on some weeks. We are in agreement that this was overall more beneficial.

Trustee Jennifer Wandasiewicz seconded by Trustee Cathy Gismervik made a motion to adjourn at 9:03 pm.
