OPTIMUM LIGHTPATH GRANT AWARD PRESENTATION: Mr. Hatch Peffer and Mrs. Carol Varsalona

Mr. Cacciola said that he was pleased to be at Santapogue for this evening's meeting. He welcomed Mr. Peffer and explained that the district received a \$10,000 grant from Optimum Lightpath. West Babylon School District was one of one hundred and fifty seven applicants of which only eleven received grants. The grant will be used towards technology professional development and a museum covering the time period of the 1920s to the 1960s. Ms. Varsalona thanked Ryan Case and Blanca Doherty for their work on the grant. She also thanked Toni Kinnear, Kris Yturraspe and Julie Powers for their work with the museum. Mr. Peffer said that Lightpath will follow-up with the recipients in the spring to see their progress. A photo was taken.

Mr. Cacciola said that a ConnectEd message had been sent to parents on Friday regarding whether or not to have a referendum regarding changing the transportation limits. The results were Yes: 451 and No: 418. He said that based on the survey there is interest in having a vote. He noted that of the 2555 possible respondents there were 869 successful responses. He clarified that this was only to see if there is interest in having a vote, not to change the limits.

Mr. Cacciola said that Facilities usage will be addressed by Mr. Graziano and Mr. Spinelli at the December 13 Board meeting.

Superintendent's Report/Educational Presentation:

BOCES Demographic Study

Mr. Cacciola said that the district has done a demographic study to project enrollment since the early 1990s. He introduced Joan Townley of Western Suffolk BOCES to present the study. Ms. Townley offered a PowerPoint Presentation discussing enrollment trends between 2004 and 2013 (on file in the District Clerk's office). Ms. Townley explained that the entire study has a 99.7% degree of accuracy. She also explained that at this time and for the next three to four years the district is not at the point of closing a building due to declining enrollment. Mr. Cacciola said that the report will be on the district's website.

L.O.T.E. Program Evaluation

Therese Coleman, Chairperson, Foreign Language Grades 6-12

Dr. Palma reminded everyone that the program evaluations are done in four year cycles. He introduced Ms. Coleman to present the evaluation to the Board (on file in the District Clerk's office). She shared the results of the JHS program evaluation that was prepared by Ms. Balducci, the former Chairperson. She explained that Russian is no longer offered at the Junior High School level. A recommendation from Ms. Coleman was for more Smart Boards, which are being used daily, when possible. There was a discussion about offering Spanish 5H and French 5 for college credit through Saint John's University. Dr. Palma said that this recommendation will be on the December 13, agenda for Board approval. Trustee DeGaetano suggested exploring beginning foreign language at an earlier age. It was noted that part of the reason that French is not as popular a language is that it is only offered during first period at the JHS, making scheduling difficult.

Trustee Thiel read the minutes of the November 7, 2011 Curriculum Committee Meeting (on file in the District Clerk's office)

Trustee Thiel discussed the recent NYSSBA Policy workshop regarding the new Dignity for All Students Legislation that she and District Clerk Amy Jones attended. She said that there is much work to be done to implement the requirements.

Trustee Jennings read the minutes of the November 17, 2011 Facilities Committee Meeting (on file in the District Clerk's office). The next meeting is scheduled for January 19, 2012.

STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE:

Trustee Thiel read the minutes of the November 9, 2011 Strategic Plan Committee Meeting (on file in the District Clerk's office)

OLD/NEW BUSINESS:

Trustee Thiel said that invitations have gone out for the December 3rd Community Engagement forum. She said that all who are interested in attending and have not received an invitation should contact Amy Jones to be added to the list. She added that the forum will begin at 9:00 a.m.

In response to Trustee Scarlatos' question Mr. Cacciola said that there will be an SMT meeting on December 12 and will address the Boston trip at that time.

Mr. Cacciola noted that there will be a special Board meeting on November 29 at 7:00 p.m. in the PAC to address the ramifications of the property tax cap.

Mr. Cacciola discussed several possible options for the Board retreat scheduled for the weekend of January 20, 2012. After some discussion it was decided that there will be a dinner on Friday evening January 20 at a local restaurant which will be paid for by Mr. Cacciola and then a full day retreat in the Board room of the administration building on Saturday, January 21, 2012. Possible topics included; having a NYSSBA facilitator discuss Board Self Evaluation or helping to prepare a budget; ask Roger Smith of BBS Architects to join the Friday evening dinner and discuss the 5 year facilities plan; ask Ron Edelson of Zimmerman Edelson to present; have Chris Venator discuss contracts; NYSSBA present information on common core standards, or help in preparing the budget in difficult times. The trustees agreed to a local retreat and expressed interest in having Roger Smith and/or Ron Edelson present at no charge to the district.

STATEMENT OF RESIDENTS

Resident Lucy Campasano said she felt the district did a disservice to residents by only including parents and not including all residents in the survey regarding the transportation limits. She said that as a taxpayer she felt disenfranchised. Mrs. Campasano added that she is opposed to changing the limits and to putting the referendum to a vote. Mr. Cacciola reminded Mrs. Campasano that the survey was done the same way when she was on the Board of Education.

Resident Dennis Kranz said that although the crossing guards do an excellent job, students are not using the crosswalks and are all over the place. He said something needs to be done to address the situation before someone gets hurt. Mr. Kranz also discussed the cuts to security which he said affects the safety of the students and staff.

Resident Colleen Pellicane said that she was not at home when the call came in for the survey and therefore, she was not able to respond.

Resident William Hill agreed with Mr. Kranz and added that many of the students are sophomores and juniors, not seniors that are out at lunch time. He said he is concerned that someone will be killed. Mr. Hill also asked if there is still a dress code in West Babylon as he has seen some inappropriate clothing on students.

Resident Dawn Lombardi discussed a recent bus incident in which her son was badly hurt by a non-student who had boarded a district school bus. She said that not all drivers are checking bus passes. She also expressed serious concern about how the bus driver handled the matter adding that the bus driver did not call 911 for her son. Mr. Cacciola said that he cannot disagree with Mrs. Lombardi that this was a horrible event. He said bus passes are being checked and letters will be mailed home to parents explaining that the buses are for students who stay after for school related matters and students will need an ID and a pass to board the buses. Mr. Cacciola said that procedure has been addressed and had he been in the situation he would have called 911.

Resident Daienna Edmunds said she was saddened by what happened to Mrs. Lombardi's son and asked why the students can't be kept in the school instead of being allowed to leave the buildings. She said that the town has changed in the last 14 years and we must do what is best for the safety of the students.

Board President Patrick Farrell thanked Mrs. Lev y for her hospitality in hosting the evening's meeting and wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.

Trustee Bocca seconded by Trustee Thiel made a motion to adjourn at 10:25 p.m.
